Deed after

guishing and ascertaining of the Lands or other Heredita-Deed after ments holden for each of such Estates, and by each of such Tenures, and the fetting out and awarding of several and distinct Allotments for such respective Lands or other Hereditaments as herein is required, and within Twelve Calendar Months after the making the faid Award Request shall be made to the faid Commissioners by any Person or Persons interested, by Writing under his, her, or their Hand or Hands, to have such Omission supplied by a separate Instrument; then and in every such Case the said Commissioners are hereby authorized to do every thing necessary for supplying such Omission, and, so far as that Purpose shall require, to examine Witnesses and in every other Respect to proceed and act as if their Award had not been made; and when they shall have obtained what they shall think sufficient Information, they are hereby also authorized, by any Deed under their Hands and Seals, to distinguish and ascertain the Disserence of such Estates and Tenures respectively, and accordingly to make distinct and several Allotments in the same Manner as is hereby required where such Discrimination should be contained in the said Award; and every fuch separate Instrument shall be inrolled in the same Place, and Evidence thereof shall be given in the same Manner, as by the said recited A& and this Act, or either of them, is directed concerning the faid Award; and all reasonable Expences incurred in or about such separate Instrument as aforesaid, shall be payable by the Person or Persons who shall have so requested the said Commissioners to make and execute the same, or by his, her, or their Heirs, Executors, or Administrators; and every such separate Instrument shall, from and immediately after the due Execution thereof by the faid Commissioners, have the same Effect to all Intents and Purposes as if the Contents thereof had been inserted and contained in their faid Award, and the same shall, after such Involment as aforefaid, be delivered to the Person or Persons upon whose Request any such Omission shall have been supplied, or to the Person or Persons to whom the Custody of the Deeds and Writings concerning the Title to the Premises in question shall, in the Opinion of the faid Commissioners, most properly belong.

Exchanges

And be it further Enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the faid Commissioners to set out, allot, and award any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments whatsoever within the faid feveral Parishes, or any of them, in lieu of and in exchange for any other Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments whatfoever within the said Parishes, or within any adjoining Parish, Hamlet, Township, or Place; provided that all such Exchanges be ascer[ 31 ]

tained, specified, and declared in the Award of the said Commissioners, and be made with the Consent of the Owner or Owners, Proprietor or Proprietors for the Time being seised of or entitled in Possession to the Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments which shall be so exchanged, or to the actual Receipt of the Rents, Issues, and Profits thereof, whether such Owner or Owners, Proprietor or Proprietors, shall be a Body or Bodies Politic or Corporate, or a Body or Bodies Collegiate, Corporation Aggregate or Sole, or a Tenant or Tenants in Fee Simple or for Life, or in Fee Tail General or Special, or by the Courtely of England, or for Years determinable on any Life or Lives, or with the Consent of the Guardians, Trustees, Feosfees for charitable or other Uses, or the major Part of such Trustees respectively, Husbands, Committees, or Attornies of or acting for any fuch Proprietors or Owners as aforesaid, who at the Time of making fuch Exchange or Exchanges shall be respectively Infants. Femes Covert, Lunatics, or under any other legal Incapacity, or who shall be beyond the Seas, or otherwise disabled to act for themselves, himself, or herself, such Consent to be testified in Writing under the Common Seal of the Body Politic, Corporate or Collegiate, and under the Hands and Seals of the other Parties respectively; and all and every such Exchange and Exchanges fo to be made shall be good, valid, and effectual in the Law, to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever; provided nevertheless, that no Exchange shall be made of any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments held in Right of any Church, Chapel, or other Ecclesiallical Benefice, without the Consent testified as aforesaid of the Patron thereof and of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese in which fuch Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments so to be exchanged shall lie or be situate: Provided always, that the Costs, Charges, and Expences, attending the making and completing any Exchanges and Partitions shall be borne and paid by the several Persons, Bodies Politic, Corporate or Collegiate, making such Exchanges or Partitions, in fuch Manner and in fuch Proportions as the faid Commissioners shall order and direct; and the fame shall and may be recovered in the Manner hereinafter directed for the Recovery of the Costs and Expences of passing and executing this Act.

And be it further Enacted, That the Proprietors whose Allot- Satisfaction ments on the faid Division shall have been tilled, ploughed, fown, to be made for Tillage, folded, or manured by any former Proprietor or Occupier there- &c. of, shall pay unto the Person or Persons respectively who shall have tilled, ploughed, fowed, folded, or manured the same or any Part

Part thereof, his, her, or their Executors or Administrators, such Sum and Sums of Money, and at fuch Time and Times, as the faid Commissioners shall think reasonable, and shall by Writing under their Hands ascertain and direct; and if by reason of the Mismanagement of any former Occupier, or of the preceding Crop or Crops, or by any other Means, it shall happen that the Allotment or Allotments to any Proprietor shall not contain a due and reasonable Proportion of Land in a proper state of Cultivation, or if any fuch Allotment or Allotments shall in the Judgment of the faid Commissioners be from any Cause in a worse Condition to be occupied than the Average of the Lands allotted by virtue hereof, then the Person or Persons to whom any such Allotment or Allotments shall be made shall receive such Compensation and Satisfaction from any other of the Proprietors, or from the former Occupier, as the faid Commissioners shall determine and adjudge to be just and equitable; and in case any of the Sums of Money which shall by the faid Commissioners be directed to be paid as aforefaid, shall not be paid to the Person or Persons and at the Time or Times to be appointed by the said Commissioners for the Payment thereof, it shall be lawful for them and they are hereby required to levy the same in like Manner as the Expences of pasfing this Act, and carrying the same and the said recited Act into execution, are directed to be raifed and levied.

Settlements. &c. not to be affected. nor Aills revoked.

Provided always, and be it further Enacted and Declared, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend to revoke, make void, annul, or alter any Settlement, Deed, or Will, or to prejudice any Person having any Right or Claim of Dower, Jointure, Annuity, Rent-Charge, Debt, or Incumbrance whatsoever in, out of, upon, or affecting any of the Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments hereby directed to be divided and allotted, or which shall be exchanged or affigned in Compensation for any other Estate or Right in pursuance of this Act respectively; but as well the Lands allotted as the Tenements and other Hereditaments which shall be assigned and taken in exchange or in Compensation for any other Estate or Right, shall immediately after such Allotment, Exchange, or Assignment shall be made, be vested, remain, and enure, and the several Persons to whom the same shall be allotted, assigned, or given in exchange as aforesaid, shall henceforth stand and be seised and possessed thereof respectively to, for, and upon fuch and the same Uses, Estates, Intents, Trusts, and Purposes respectively, and subject and liable to such and the same Wills, Settlements, Limitations and Remainders, Conditions, Charges, and Incumbrances, as the feveral Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments

ditaments in respect whereof such Allotments, Assignments, and Exchanges shall have been made should or would have stood feverally limited, fettled, vested, or subject or liable to, or been held by in case the same had not been allotted, assigned, or exchanged, and this Act had not been made; fave and except fuch Rents and Services as shall have been compensated for and extinguished, and such Leales and Tenancies at such Rent as shall become void by virtue of this Act.

Time such Deduction shall take place; and the rest of the Rent reserved on any such Lease or Agreement shall, during the Remain-der of the Term thereof, be the Rent of and for the Lands and Hereditaments in such other Parish or Parishes, Place or Places, and shall be payable and recoverable in like Manner as the entire for such Apportionment be payable and recoverable: Provided shall lie in any of the said respective Parishes, and Part in any adat Rack Rent now substituting may be vacated; but where such Lease, and wholly situate in an adjoining Parish or Township, all and every such Lease and Leases Land shall have been taken in exchange, and shall be under the Lease of such last-mentioned Land shall not be vacated.

Money adanced to be repaid with Interest.

And be it further Enacted, That the Money that shall be advanced by any Person or Persons for the Purpose of descriping after the passing thereof shall be advanced or lent to or to be same into execution, shall be repaid with lawful Interest to the Person or Persons lending, advancing, or paying the same out of taining and executing this Act.

Expences of this. Act.

And be it further Enacted, That the Costs and Charges of and incident to and attending the obtaining and passing this Act, of furveying, admeasuring, planning, dividing, and allotting the Open and Common Fields, Meadows, Pastures, and other Commonable Lands and Waste Grounds hereby directed to be divided and inclosed and exonerated from Tythes, and of making the public Roads to be fet out, and of preparing and inrolling the Award of the faid Commissioners, and all the Charges and Expences of the laid Commissioners, and of the several Persons to be employed by them, either before or after the Execution of the faid Award, in, about, or concerning the Execution of this or the faid recited Act, shall be borne and defrayed by all the Proprietors and Owners of or Persons having Rights or Interests in the faid Lands and Grounds hereby directed to be divided, allotted, and inclosed (except the said several Rectors, Vicars, and Impropriators, and their Successors, for and in respect of the Allotn ents to be made to them respectively as such Rectors, Vicars, and Impropriators as aforesaid), in such Proportions,

and shall be paid to such Person or Persons, and at such Time or Times and from Time to Time, either before or after the Execution of the faid Award, as shall be settled, adjusted, determined, and directed by the faid Commissioners by any Writing under their Hands; and the several Sum and Sums of Money thereby rated shall be paid to such Person or Persons, and at such Time or Times, and in such Manner as the said Commissioners shall in and by their faid Award, or any other Writing under their Hands, before or after the Execution of their faid Award, order, direct, or appoint; and in case any Person or Persons shall refuse or neglect to pay his, her, or their Share or Proportion of fuch Costs, Charges, Sums of Money, and Expences as aforesaid, within the Time, and to fuch Person or Persons as the said Commissioners shall appoint, then and in such Case it shall and may be lawful to and for the faid Commissioners, by any Warrant or Warrants under their Hands and Seals directed to any Person or Persons whomsoever, to cause the said Costs, Charges, and Sums of Money to be levied by Distress and Sale of the Goods and Chattels of the Person or Persons so making Default in Payment as aforesaid, his, her, or their Husbands, Guardians, Trustees, or Committees, wherefoever the fame shall be found, rendering the Overplus (if any) on Demand to the Owner or Owners of fuch Goods and Chattels, the reasonable Charges of such Warrant, Distress, and Sale being first deducted, together with Interest after the Rate of Five Pounds per Centum per Annum, to be computed on fuch Share or Shares, Proportion or Proportions, from the Time the same shall be directed to be paid as aforesaid; or otherwife it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, or any Person or Persons authorized by them, to enter upon and take Possession of the Messuages, Tenements, Orchards, Home Closes, or other Ancient Inclosures partitioned, exchanged, or discharged from Tythes as aforesaid; and also of the several Allotments made to fuch Person or Persons so refusing or neglecting to pay as aforefaid, and to receive and take the Rents and Profits thereof until thereby, therewith, or otherwise, the Share or Shares, Proportion or Proportions of the faid Costs, Charges, Sums of Money, and Expences so ordered and directed to be paid by such Person or Perfons as aforefaid; and all Interest on such Share or Shares, Proportion or Proportions, to be computed from the Time the same shall be directed to be paid as aforesaid, and also all Costs, Charges, and Expences occasioned by or attending such Entry upon fuch Premises, and the Receipt of the Rents and Profits of the Premises, shall be fully paid and satisfied.

And be it further Enacted, That each of the Commissioners acting in Execution of the Trusts and Powers hereby vested in them shall be allowed and paid, in Satisfaction for their Trouble and Expences, the Sum of Two Pounds Twelve Shillings and Sixpence for every Day on which they shall be respectively employed in travelling to, attending on, or returning from fo acting; and at all Meetings to be held in pursuance of this and the said recited Act the said Commissioners thall pay their own Expences; and none of the faid Commissioners shall be allowed for more than One Day in travelling to and One Day in travelling from the Place of Meeting.
