

THE CIRCUS FLOWER PARADE THEME FOR 1978 TO TOWN

People who love the colour, excitement and razamataz of the Big Top can savour it in a unique way in Spalding on Flower Parade Day, Saturday May 6, when the theme is "The circus comes to town"

We know that some of the nation's hearts and minds will be concentrated exclusively on the unarmed combat going on around 100 miles south at

Wembley Football stadium.

But, putting the thing in perspective, we're proud as Punch to tell you that up here in Spalding we have three Wembleys in one. For the shouting crowds at the Cup Final will number a mere 100,000 while we expect to play host to at least three times that number the same day.

It's the 20th parade, the biggest and best ever (that's official from the Flower Parade committee) and many of Spalding's 17,000 citizens will be actively engaged in making your day a happy

and safe one.

Everyone loves a circus - didn't the Romans use "bread and circuses" to keep the mob happy? - and the theme is a natural for our talented parade

designer, Kees van Driel.

Just imagine what someone whose favourite design subject is animals and engaging, vastly comic ones at that has been able to do with lions, tigers, dancing bears, circus ponies, not to mention the jugglers, clowns, acrobats and other colourful circus folk.

There are 20 floats this year — and it's taken local blacksmith Geoff Dodd and strawing expert Pete Bell most of the winter to create them from the designer's delicate colour-wash fantasy

drawings.


Visitors are always amazed at the size of some of the floats which with police outriders, around a dozen carnival bands, vintage cyclists and other entertainers make up the parade which will pass by them on its 41/2-mile route.

Miss Tulipland's float - and quite right too - leads the parade, and you'll see the pretty girl chosen by South Holland District Council riding high with her deputy and accompanied by 'pages" recruited from local schools.

Look out, too, for the Magpie float and the popular personalities from this

Thames Television show.

Much of this work is done under contract by local charity groups and you may well find someone next to you among our happy crowd who won't be able to resist telling you he put in the eye of that tiger — and has sore thumbs to prove it.

Float exhibition a big attraction

The float exhibition in the Halley Stewart Field in Winfrey Avenue, Spalding, is a "must" for most visitors — and especially if they are unable to be with us for the parade itself. For the twenty or so superb floats will be there on display from 10.30 a.m. on Parade Day, May 6 and, except for the actual parade time, will be on show until 8pm.

On Sunday, May 7 — the time when many thousands of people come to see them — the floats can be seen from 9am to 8pm. The show continues on Monday and Tuesday, also from 9am to 8pm. Prices are 60p adults, 30p children each day but on May 8-9 there is a special rate of 50p for



Super Springfields

No-one on a visit to Spalding should leave without taking the opportunity of seeing Springfields, the unique twentyacre garden open through the spring and summer months.

It is difficult to believe that little over 12 years ago Springfields was just a few acres of fenland on the edge of town growing sugar beet for the nearby factory.

The transformation in the intervening years has been remarkable, and it is hard to appreciate there has not been a

garden permanently on the spot.

Since its opening in 1966 as the "shop window" of the British bulb industry, Springfields has more than justified the faith of a handful of far-sighted growers who took the initial gamble.

Started purely as a garden for spring flowering bulbs it has developed into a horticultural centre in a much wider sense with immense teaching potential.

Now, when the dazzling display in the spring produced by millions of brightly coloured bulbs in flower has come to an end in May, the garden remains open. Roses, dahlias, summer flowering shrubs and thousands of bedding plants have been introduced to extend the open season through the summer months.

The decision to remain open marked a milestone in the development of Springfields, begun as a dream by a small band of South Lincolnshire bulb growers.

Against tremendous odds they persuaded their colleagues that a garden project on such a massive scale was not only feasible but a vital necessity for the future well being and prosperity of their own industry.

They saw the garden as an educational venture aimed at the nation's gardeners showing them "on the ground" how to make the best use of bulbs in their own gardens.

To turn their dream into reality they obtained the services of a brilliant Dutch designer, Mr C. van Empelen. There can

be no doubt that the garden has been a success, giving a boost, as planned, to the sale of dry bulbs, and at the same time pleasure to nearly two million visitors.

Now it is hoped the same can be done for summer flowers. The breakthrough came in 1975 when the directors of Springfields Horticultural Society Ltd. accepted a change of direction and signed an agreement with the British Association of Rose Breeders whose secretary is that redoubtable rose breeder Jack Harkness.


Several thousand roses were planted in the drought months of 1975 but very few died and they were ready for the opening by the Duchess of Gloucester in July the following year.

In August the same year the first dahlias, planted in the garden by Ayletts of St Albans, recognised as one of the country's leading dahlia growers, added to the summer attraction. Last year saw further planting of roses and there are now 10,000 rose bushes of new and popular varieties in the garden.

Agreement has also been reached with the Bedding Plant Association to introduce a large display of some 20,000 bedding plants this summer including begonias, marigold, petunias, salvias, micotinia, larkspur and cineraria.

Among the roses visitors will discover a fine orange floribunda bred by Dixons of Belfast, named Springfields, after the garden — a rose which is to be featured in this year's Chelsea flower show. One of the immediate problems is to introduce summer flowering shrubs into a garden which has previously concentrated on the spring season.

Notcoutts and Hilliers have already made a start with lilacs and a conifer border. There is also a fine display of clematis provided by Harringtons of Wisbech. Which all goes to make Springfields a unique experience not to be missed.

SPRINGFIELDS FOR FLOWERS — AND FUN

The country entertains the town every Flower Parade weekend as thousands flock to Spalding and Springfields by bus, excursion train, or their own transport.

On Parade Day itself many arrive hours before the Big Show and thousands of them choose to go straight to Springfields and let the show come to them.

For the parade (at about its half-way point) makes its way along the half mile of roadway within the garden's Arena area — and stops for a well-deserved breather, much to the photographers' delight.

But the obvious charms of Springfields — its sensational mix of spring flowers, formal gardens, trees, pathways, lake and woodland walks — is not the only attraction to beguile the visitor over parade weekend.

For all Springfields visitors are welcome at no extra charge to the "Country Fair" held in the arena where shoppers can browse and buy among corn dollies, leatherwork, pottery, painting and other country matters, while enjoying other special events, including a comedy act and exotic animals.

The fair is in addition to the permanent shops — some of which trade right through from April to October — where there is everything to delight the gardener, photographic supplies, craft goods and this year a specialist in country and craft books.

Springfields extra events begin on the weekend of April 7, when the gardens open with an indoor daffodil show.

If the season starts wet and windy there will be this great splash of colour to see in comfort to add to the special tulip specimens in the variety glasshouse and the pleasures of wandering in comfort in the garden glasshouse.

Springfields celebrated the Jubilee last year by planting a maze using fast-growing Cupressa Leylandii which in two or three years will be a towering nine feet in height.

Children already love it and to add to their fun there are the Springfields games — giant versions of chess, snakes and ladders, and other favourites which can be played on the lawns.

Once Tulip Time is past around mid-May, the gardens slip gently into the summer season via an extensive range of colourful bedding plants.

The roses, of course, crown the summer season. At Springfields, and at Springfields only, for the first time you can see the best NEW roses chosen by most of the world's leading breeders.

The Springfields year ends on a glorious highnote of colour in October with the final eye-catching spectacle of thousands of multi-coloured dahlias in bloom.

And don't forget that the garden's information kiosk will answer all your queries and that throughout the year Springfields Restaurant is on the spot to serve you.

The choice is yours — from quick snack cafeteria service at Tulip Time, daily bar and salad meals or lunching or dining in style where the view is perhaps one of the finest a restaurant can offer in Britain.

There are future plans too for Springfields Gardens, designed for the enthusiast, and including rose weekends, and possibly an autumn bulb fair and dahlia show.



PARADE ON TV

Magpie stars to ride on float for programme

Murgatroyd the Magpie, that knowing bird from Thames Television's popular children's magazine programme, will be turning his bright eye on Spalding Flower Parade.

DECORATION

Begun by Thames Television in 1968, Magpie is now watched regularly in eight to ten million homes twice weekly throughout the country.

WIDE RANGE

Designed for the 8-14 age group, it has fans of all ages and each programme covers a wide range of items, and there are regular features which allow the great diversity of subjects to be treated in greater depth.

Sometimes a whole programme is devoted to one subject (though Lesley Burgess told us she expected the Flower parade visit to add up to a ten-minute item) and recently, for instance, the Magpie team made a programme on the special effects used in television.

Magpie has been to countries as far apart as Holland and Hong Kong to show its viewers other people's everyday life and history, and the programme receives

an enormous amount of letters each week.





The flower parade is just a by-product — very thankfully — and a very colourful one too.





The area of South Lincolnshire centred on Spalding has traditionally been one of low property prices. There are isolated pockets or areas through the country which enjoy property at considerably lower values that the south of England, and perhaps the main reason for this in South Lincolnshire is that it is an area mainly based on agriculture and therefore has had a relatively stable population because industrial development has been lacking.

However, prices are on the move again in this area, and during the course of the last year to 18 months prices have risen by approximately 15 or even 20 per cent in certain price ranges in this

The traditional detached three bedroomed estate type property, with garage and central heating, has risen from approximately £10,000 to something in the region of £12,000 during this period. Similarly, the semi-detached type of property, offering three bedroomed accommodation with garage and central heating, has also risen from approximately £9,000 to £10,000. Lower down the market, the traditional town house of terraced construction, probably built before the first world war, has risen from £6,000 to £7,000.

Country property has always been in strong demand in this area, particularly from buyers from the south of England, who are quite prepared to move up to this area, buy a property, often for cash, having sold a property for a much higher figure in the south of England, and then to look round for employment. Country cottages range in price, depending on their location, whether they are modernised or not, and the amount of land that is being sold with them, from £4,000 to £15,000.

The supply of property in this area has shortened considerably during the first few months of 1978 as a result of many people taking the opportunity to purchase a property before the much publicised property boom is felt in this area. There is no doubt that new development in the Spalding area will see prices in excess of those quoted above, and because of the short supply of property, prices will continue to rise steadily during 1978, assuming that there is a reasonably steady flow of mortgage funds available from the Building Societies. The private sector of the housing market in this country is at present seeing considerable changes in values similar to but not as exceptional as the property boom in 1971 and 1972. The increase in prices for both new and second-hand property is being experienced throughout the country in varying degrees.

There are many reasons for a mini property boom, but the value of property in most areas is linked closely to the cost of new building. During the course of the last four or five years property developers have made every attempt to maintain a relatively low selling price in an effort to promote sales in difficult selling times. They have been able to do this despite huge rates of inflation in the Building Industry for the raw materials and labour because many had substantial land banks available of relatively cheap land.

However, developers are now building on more expensive land and this has resulted in the prices of new property having to be increased substantially.
Unlike the boom of 1971/72, the Building Societies

are in a somewhat different situation today. The mortgage rate has decreased considerably during the course of the last 12 months, and it now stands at 81/2 per cent. The Building Societies' Association as a whole lent record advances during the course of 1977 and as a result of the slowing down of inflow of funds are now finding themselves somewhat restricted again on advancing loans for house purchase.

As a result, it is unlikely at the present time, we are

going to see enormous rates of increase in values of

property because of this restriction.

There is no doubt that nationally prices have increased during the course of the last 12 to 18 months by something in the region of 10 to 15 per cent, and it is generally agreed within the building industry that prices will continue to rise thorughout 1978 by perhaps a further 10 to 15 per cent. Unfortunately, this will mean that many house purchasers, especially those purchasing for the first time, will again be stretched to the limit on borrowing requirements, and only those who have owned property for a relatively longer period of time will have had sufficient equity built up as a result of increase in prices to allow them to borrow a relatively small amount on mortgage. However, the Building Societies as a whole have been given directives that first time purchasers will have as much preference as possible, and the Government have also brought in certain measures to ease the problem of finding the initial deposit.

Therefore, it would seem that 1978 is going to be one of steady growth throughout the building industry in the country, and will see a sharpening of prices both for new and second-hand property.


