Up, up and away for parade

Spalding Flower Parade! This year's theme is Mother Earth - an apt title for this area which thrives on flower and food manufacturing and distribution.

This is a particularly exciting year for us because there are plans for the future of Springfields, which could attract even more visitors to Spalding - see pages 37-41.

We are also delighted to welcome Tesco to the flower parade this year - as overall sponsor and with a float in the parade.

It will be a joint Tesco/Save the Children float, because the organisation has been adopted by Tesco as its main charity for the year.

As it is Save the Children's 75th birthday this year, the float should be pretty spectacular!

Centrepiece of the float will be a magnificent hot air balloon, featuring a map of the world and carrying the Quizkids, two popular children's magazine characters called Simon and Bee, and their friend, Streetwise the Mouse.

The Quizkids have been adopted by Tesco to mark the link-up, and will be featuring on a number of special fund-raising products to be sold in Tesco stores.

Tesco staff will also be hard at work, raising funds for Save the Children, and the Tesco Charity Trust will add 20 per cent to

whatever the staff raise.

Save the Children is the UK's largest international children's charity and now has around 100 projects in the UK, on which it spends one third of its voluntary income - £15.6m last year.

But the parade of floats on Saturday, May 7 isn't the only entertainment.

normally on duties involving football



DRESSES FIT FOR A QUEEN

HOLBEACH seamstress Gill Ball makes dresses fit for a queen - and has fitted out one or two in her time!

They're South Holland's floral queens of course, the sort that regularly grace our hospitals, old people's homes and fetes with their presence.

But it's the flower queens of over 30 years ago that Gill particularly likes to see in old photographs, because the chances are it's her work that has gone into creating the perfect fit.

Gill spent some years working at the former F W Hansons department store in Spalding, where she worked her way up from the hand sewing machines, to treadle machines before reaching the dizzy heights of the electric machines and being in charge of the workroom.

It was Gill who created a dark blue velvet robe for the flower queen in about 1958, which was used by many flower

queens before being discarded.

Gill says: "The queen's was usually a wedding dress and her attendants wore bridesmaids dresses which were altered by we girls in the workroom.

"We always looked forward to them coming in. Then, when the dresses were all pressed and complete we had the excitement of carrying them to the White Hart Hotel ready for the crowning ceremony.



☐ PICTURED RIGHT: New this year is the German Oompah Band, or Die Apfeltizers, who will be playing on the top of a Michelin bus!


Formed in 1992, the group has proved popular playing locally and are available to peform at German evenings involving party games or to provide background music in traditional German style.

Council float now fit for a flower queen


LOOK out for South Holland Council's float in the parade, when it will be carrying the flower queen and her attendants - and a blaze of colourful butterflies.

A new float has been designed for the council this year as their last one was five years old.

The council's contract manager (parks)
Peter Moore said: "It's the longest we
have ever kept one.

"They do deteriorate and they are not designed or built to last that long.

"We had been gradually changing the old one, trying to modify it to make it look different. It did look past its best."






Where would Flower Parade be without Robin?

OBIN Chappell makes a very important contribution to Spalding Flower Parade - two to three million of them, in fact!

Robin, who runs Poplars Farm

in Spalding in partnership with his brother David, supplies about 70 per cent of the tulip heads used to decorate the floats each year.

To him, they're a by-product of the bulb industry because the flower head has to removed for the following year's bulb production.

To us, they are a wonderful spectacle on the magnificent floats, a glorious display of the flowers that were once seen in tulip fields all over

South Holland.

He said: "Where we used to machine-head them, we get labour in and do it by hand for the parade.

"We are still growing about 20

acres of tulips, and that's enough to put a parade on.

"We struggle sometimes for certain colours because they are early and gone before the time comes.

"That's the biggest trouble, getting the colours.

"We are more into daffodils than tulips and for the last two or three years we have

exported about 800,000 blooms to Holland and Germany for the Easter period."

Tulip heads used for floats a by-product of the bulb industry

T TAKES 13 to 14 miles of steel to make the floats for a big parade, more than 2,000 metres of foam and at least a hundred gallons of glue.

It also takes a craftsman's eye to interpret drawings sent from float designer Kees Van Driel in Australia to produce the flowing lines which end up as the magnificent shapes thousands of visitors see on parade day.

That eye belongs to blacksmith Geoff Dodd, who hesitates to admit he has developed an artist's eye over the many years he has been building the floats.

He says simply: "I am a craftsman, not an artist. It needs a bit of an eye, but it's largely experience.

"We are building floats now that even after I had been doing it for ten-12 years I couldn't have attempted. It's just experience.

"Often, things don't look quite right. A real artist would know why and what to do. I only get one go at it."

Kees comes to South Lincolnshire at the beginning of November, bringing with him float designs he has drawn up for the various companies taking part in the parade.

Geoff, who has worked for Kees and his father before him for 35 years now, says: "We understand each other. He knows what I can do and, generally speaking, I know what he wants."

The designs, once approved, are translated into working drawings and Geoff then works from full-scale transparencies projected on to the wall in his workshop, creating parts of the design before the float is welded together.

Geoff, blacksmith like his father and grandfather before him, says his greatest satisfaction this year was in creating the 12 feet high, 18 feet long octopus on the Olau float.


The metal is covered in polyethylene foam by Mick Pratt.

Mick is also involved with the floats when they have been decorated in flower heads, when he makes sure each one carries the sponsor's name.

Geoff is unsentimental about the finished floats, and says much of his work ends up as a lorry-load of rubbish.

They do save one or two parts which will be used again, but he says there is no room to store them all.

The last stage in the floatbuilding process is when flower heads are pinned on and visitors have a chance to watch that work in progress. See page 13.

Which is part of the reason that this year he will receive the Worshipful Company of Gardeners' Trophy.

Awarded every year since 1956, the trophy is presented in recognition of "an outstanding contribution to Tulip Time".

The Master of the Worshipful Company of Gardeners will present the trophy at a civic lunch at Spalding's South Holland Centre on parade day.

Mr Hanson, who lives in Spalding, was chairman of the Tulip Time Committee, as it was called, in 1956 when the Duke and Duchess of Gloucester visited South Holland.

Tulip Queen travelled in".


That was the turning point towards the parade as we know it today, with the first parade of six floats in 1958.

You don't HAVE to be mad...

I THINK you have to be of a mind to be a bit eccentric" says secretary of Long Sutton and District Veteran Cycle Club Nicola Wellband of its members.

It has to be the understatement of the year, when you consider that many of them take their ancient bikes to places like the Cotswolds - and most of their machines have no gears and no brakes!

But the veteran cyclists have endeared themselves to flower parade visitors over the years, not just with their enchanting period costumes and cycles from yesteryear, but with the antics of the Penny Farthing riders, the children who take part and the sense of fun they bring with them.

Nicola has only been riding in parades for the past ten years, although cycling goes back a long way in her family.

One of her four bikes is a 1920s A B Popular made in Spalding by Beale's Cycling Co, owned by a great uncle of her father, Anthony Beale-Wellband.

Her great great grandfather won a cycling competition in Spalding in 1880 on a Penny Farthing!

The club has been going since 1957 and its membership has grown to about 100, including two founder members, Randolph Churchill and Bridget Ellis.

Their aims are to collect, restore, preserve and ride veteran (pre-1914) and vintage (to 1930) cycles, although Nicola says they are becoming harder and harder to find - so if you still have granny's bike in the shed, contact Nicola on 0775 723941.

The flower parade is the highlight of their year and Nicola expects as many as 60 riders to be entertaining the crowds this year - so give them a big cheer when they pass by!

It will be the club's 34th appearance in Spalding Flower Parade.



Tips to make the day go smoothly





World of Flowers vision for Springfields

World of Flowers is the £1.5million vision for the future that could give Spalding's famous Springfields Gardens an exciting facelift.

Thousands of visitors have enjoyed the large, attractive gardens over the vears.

Built originally in 1966 as a showpiece for the bulb-growing area of South Holland, the gardens are the largest in the area - 25 acres - and probably the only one of its type in the country.

The transformation now proposed would change the gardens into a new family concept park, with broader interests to attract lots more families and other visitors!

The exciting plan is linked to a proposal for a new Tesco superstore on part of the Camelgate site.

If the superstore gets the go-ahead, £1.5m from the deal will be invested in World of Flowers.

The new gardens would include:

- display gardens
- · a boating lake
- play and picnic areas
- themed areas, such as the history of British garden design or examples of different gardens for different locations.
- More trees and shrubs would be planted between the park and the proposed



Springfields: World of Flowers is the vision which could take Spalding's largest garden to the end of the century and beyond, into the 21st century.

The vision would involve the creation of a horticultural attraction aimed at bringing in families as well as amateur gardeners.

Springfields arena would have a number of new enclosures to be used for events throughout the year especially the annual Flower Festival and Parade.

The arena area would be restructured with planting and be incorporated into the main gardens, with display areas

'World of Flowers would help ensure the future of Spalding Flower Parade' and walkways.

A grand concourse, a main area for walking through the gardens, would be just inside the new main entrance and provide a link to all the new features, which include:

- play and educational areas;
- picnic and eating areas;
- new buildings, including a display pavilion.

A series of themed enclosures would be situated between the boating lake and the woodland next to the A16 bypass.

Examples of themes might be "the history of British garden design" or examples of different gardens for different locations.

Springfields Council say if the scheme is successful, it would create a valuable asset for the district and the nation. It would provide continued employment for 100 staff,

and help ensure the future of the Flower Parade.
