



Welcome one and all

A word of greeting from 2009 Spalding Flower Parade manager DAVID NORTON

HIS year's parade has been organised in record time. It was only in mid-December that the decision was finally made that it could go ahead.

During last summer there had been considerable public debate about its future. This resulted in a campaign to highlight the importance of the parade as a visitor attraction, as well as reminding everyone of its significance as a celebration of South Holland's links to tulip growing and the many years of community participation connected to the parade weekend festivities.

The response demonstrated the affection that many local people still hold for the event, 50 years on from the first official Tulip Parade in 1959, and acknowledged the important role the parade had played in making Spalding such a well-known tourist destination (wherever you go in the world, if you say you come from Spalding someone will always say "isn't that where they have the flower parade?").

The outcome of this action was a commitment from Lincolnshire County Council and South Holland

District Council to support the parade for a further five years and to work with the organisers on the development of the event as part of a broader based festival reflecting all that is good about Spalding and South Holland – its major industries linked to fresh produce, food production and distribution; its landscape and waterways; its horticultural heritage, and its community and cultural achievements.

The 2009 "new-look" parade will still pass through the centre of Spalding and includes a floral cavalcade of traditional floats decorated in fresh tulip heads, marching bands and dancers as well as other entries from local community groups and villages. There will also be a carnival section, with more than 180 school children taking part in a choreographed music and dance performance all along the parade route.

The parade involves many other voluntary groups and commercial sponsors and is still recognised as one of the UK's most important annual events.

It brings much needed income to many local charities and good causes as well as attracting a roadside audience of tens of thousands of visitors from all over



the country.

In addition to the parade, many churches will be holding their own flower festivals during April and May and throughout the parade weekend the Spalding Flower Festival, which is being organised by the Spalding Flower Parade and Carnival Trust, will be held in the Springfields Festival Gardens and Events Centre. It will include flower arrangement displays, Chelsea Gold Medal plant growers, marching bands and even a circus.

Throughout South Holland there

will be a wide range of other activities and attractions, including a window dressing competition for Spalding's town centre shops, street entertainment, Tuby's funfair and a parade in the village of Moulton Chapel on the Bank Holiday Sunday, as well as special events in many local towns and villages.

The organising committee, officials, volunteer helpers, sponsors and participants very much appreciate you coming to join us in celebrating our world-famous parade.

Whether it's your first parade or you are a parade veteran, I am sure you will have a most enjoyable day.

After the parade weekend, when you're showing your photographs to your friends and family, remember that Spalding and South Holland has something to offer all year round, so why not come back to see us some time later in the year, perhaps when it's a little bit quieter?

On behalf of all of those involved with the parade and the residents of Spalding, we look forward to welcoming you here and hope you have a memorable parade day.

HE'S A STAR ...

AVID Norton, the 2009 Spalding Flower Parade manager, is the recipient of this year's Worshipful Company of Gardeners Award. The award is made each year in recognition of the contribution made by an individual or group to the parade, which as well as being a major tourist attraction is still seen as an important means of promoting the agricultural and horticultural industry of South Holland.

David is the chief executive of Springfields Horticultural Society, which is the charitable organisation which owns and operates Springfields Festival Gardens in Spalding.

The gardens were opened in 1966 and have always been used by the flower bulb industry to raise public awareness about the growing and cultivation of flowers from bulbs, and the broader social benefits of horticulture and gardening as a

means of relaxation and enjoyment.

Organising the parade has for many years been one of the duties undertaken by the society's chief executive, and as well as being parade manager for 2009 David has organised eight other parades (from 2000 to 2007).

He also introduced the Spalding Flower Parade as the UK's representative event within the World Tulip Summit Group which resulted in the 2008 World Tulip Summit being held here in Spalding.

David said: "I have to thank the trustees of the society and the officers of South Holland District Council for nominating me for this important award. Recognition by the Worshipful Company of Gardeners is something special and when I look back at all the other individuals and groups that have received the award in the past, I can appreciate the important role that so many people

have played in ensuring the significant reputation of the Spalding Flower Parade is passed on from year to year.

"During my time as organiser I have seen many changes – fewer tulips grown in the area and therefore fewer of the traditional flower floats, the introduction of live musical performance floats and the integration of the very popular carnival section.

"I have also experienced the terrific support of many other people who help to make the parade happen and without whose experience and dedication we would not have achieved our 50th birthday last year.

"This award is also for them, and for our sponsors and volunteers, all of whom have helped me through this enjoyable 'challenge' each year and make the May Bank Holiday Saturday such a great occasion for Spalding and South Holland."





Church flower festivals a stunning show of colour

INCOLNSHIRE has one of the finest collections of medieval churches in England. In Anglo-Saxon times, the areas of dry land that rose above the fen attracted religious communities, which explains why the oldest churches are situated in a ring around the Wash.

The churches of South Holland can take you on a journey through time and the area displays a wealth of architecture from Norman times to the 20th century.

Each church has its own story to tell, from the famous leaded timber spire of St Mary's Church in Long Sutton to the St Laurence Church in Surfleet, which until recently had the lightest peal of 12 bells in the world.

Spalding Flower Parade – how it works on the day

REMINISCENCE of the last 50
Years will be the theme of the floral cavalcade section of this year's parade, with a single memorable flower float chosen from the 1960s, '70s, '80s, '90s and the 2000s being recreated to demonstrate the wide range of float designs which have made an appearance throughout the 50 year history of the parade (see facing page).

These floats have all been built with the assistance and support of the Spalding Flower Parade and Carnival Trust and each one has been made with the traditional methods used since the parade first started.

Firstly the Trust's blacksmiths lan Cauldwell and Richard Creasey construct the metal frameworks, often with a vintage farm tractor underneath where the float driver will sit.

They work with designs and drawings provided by float designer Jacquie Barnes. The frames are then covered with sheets of polystyrene foam which are glued on to provide the smooth surface to which the tulips can be attached. Every float then has thousands of tulip heads

pinned on by hand in the two days before the parade. Final decorations and bouquets are added before the float riders get into position about an hour before the parade.

There is a wide range of other float entries in the parade plus bands, community groups and the exciting carnival section at the

During the morning of the parade, the stewards – in their distinctive tabards and caps – will join Spalding Police and their colleagues, who have been drafted in from other areas, all along the route to ensure the safety and enjoyment of all our visitors.

We hope everyone will cooperate with them in their duties. If you are asked to move, please do so to assist the progress of the



floats are passing, particularly in the town centre.

Any lost children should be reported to the nearest police officer who will be able to radio the parade control office and pass on the details.

In addition to the stewards, you

At I pm the floral cavalcade section of the parade will travel around the arena in the Spalding Flower Festival site at Springfields, where the parade queen will also be enthroned on the newly designed queen's float, being seen in the parade for the first time this year.

At 2pm the cavalcade of floats will join up with the rest of the parade on the Fulney Road field and then set off on its two-hour journey around the town to the Sir Halley Stewart Field.

There will be another change to the route this year and the parade will not travel up Love Lane or along Churchgate, but will turn directly up Church Street instead and end up going straight over High Bridge and on into the centre of town.

There will be no public access to the Sir Halley Stewart Field, where the parade ends, although the floral cavalcade floats will remain on display on Sunday and Monday, from 10am to 4pm for photograph opportunities.

The only official collectors during the parade will be the Spalding and District Young Farmers' Club.

The proceeds of the collection will be used to help with the costs of the parade and by the Young Farmers' Club itself to support the work that they do within the community and with local charitable organisations.

They make every penny count, give their services voluntarily and would like to thank everyone, in advance, for their generosity.

And so the 2009 parade begins – please give your support to all those taking part and cheer them on their way!

Floats take us all down memory lane

HE floral cavalcade in this year's parade will feature a redesigned lead float to carry the Lincolnshire Free Press Parade Queen and five others representing each of the five decades since the parade began:

- 1960s The Tortoise from 1967
- 1970s The Magic Roundabout/Dougal from 1972
- 1980s World Wildlife Fund/panda from 1988
- 1990s Space Odyssey from 1999
- 2000s Chitty Chitty Bang Bang from 2003.

They have been brought up to date and all have some relevance to South Holland as it is today.

The cavalcade leaves PA Bowman's yard in Camel Gate at 1pm and will parade around the festival site at Springfields before travelling up Camel Gate and turning right at the roundabout on to Holbeach Road.

The cavalcade will then turn left into Queen's Road and the rest of the parade will be waiting to fall in at Fulney Playing Field before continuing its journey around the town, finishing at the Sir Halley Stewart Field at about 4.30pm.

Health and safety considerations ensure good time for crowds

WITH around 100,000 people descending on Spalding on parade day, crowd safety is of paramount importance.

Each year parade organisers and Spalding police work together in a bid to keep visitors safe and avoid any accidents.

Floats are staggered as they travel through the town to allow emergency vehicles access.

Parade organiser David Norton said: "We have done various exercises to see how we would cope with emergencies on parade day and we will have more stewards on the day, particularly to lead the floats through the town centre."

People are asked to exercise care along the parade route and not to cross in front of the floats to help avoid accidents.

If it's a particularly hot day heat stroke can be a major problem, especially for those people riding on floats in the sun for about four hours.

St John Ambulance has people on hand at various points around the town to treat anyone who falls ill or is injured and, of course, ambulance crews are always on standby to deal with emergencies.

The float contains Japanese cranes that have been created by pupils from the Boston area. The project was based at Woodland Organic Farm in Kirton, who also provided the trailer. The willow birds were constructed by pupils from the Giles School, Boston High School, Boston Grammar School, Thomas Cowley and Haven High School. The students worked with willow artist Spencer Jenkins for

a week at Woodlands Farm to create the sculptures that will be permanently sited on the farm. The float also contains a modern interpretation of Japanese seating created by staff at the Giles School.







ROMSEY OLD CADETS CARNIVAL MARCHING BAND

A group of friends from the Romsey area, (who all had been youths together and joined the Army Cadet Force) decided, due to their love of fun and their ability to play instruments, that they would enter a local carnival dressed as Arabs or, as they titled themselves, "The Sons of the Sand".

After causing a sensation, they advertised for like-minded gents to broaden their musical sound. As numbers grew, an association was formed in 1963.




