Demission of William Williams  
Rose under the care of Joseph Rose



The Manor of Spalding

30<sup>th</sup> October 1846



At a General Court Baron of Maurice Johnson Esquire Lord of the said Manor holder in and for the same on Friday the Thirtieth day of October in the tenth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lady Queen Victoria A.D. in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty six by and before John Richard Carter Gentleman General of the Courts of the said Manor.

Amongst other things it is thus noted

The Death of Joseph Rose late one of the customary tenants of this Manor and thereupon proclamation was made for any person or persons claiming title to the customary or copyhold hereditaments lying within and holden of this Manor whereof the said Joseph Rose presented died seized to come into Court and be admitted.

The Will of the said Joseph Rose also presented that the said Joseph Rose in and by his last Will and Testament in writing bearing date the fifth day of September one thousand eight hundred and twenty five a copy whereof is now produced in Court have and devise in the words following that is to say "I Give devise and present my bequests unto my son William Rose his heirs and assigns when he shall attain the age of twenty one years all my real estate wheresoever situate"

William Willers Rose Now at this Court came William Willers Rose and humbly prayed the Lord of this Manor to be admitted Tenant to all and singular the customary or copyhold arrears in and the freehold hereditaments lying within and holden of this Manor whereof the said Joseph Rose so lately died seized as aforesaid, to wit All that his one moiety fourth part of the said Joseph Rose's or share the whole into four equal parts or shares to be divided of among All that Arreage or Rentment or buildings and gardens to the same belonging and adjoining situate in Spalding aforesaid late in the tenure of John Tracy since of Bainbridge are now of John Capps Lomas both by the Estate late of Elizabeth Rose and now of William Hicklode East, by the Estate of Theophilus Russel Buckworth South by the Estate now or late of William Rose and Eleanor his wife and West by the High Street or Turnpike Road leading from Spalding to Holbeach And also of all that other Arreage or Rentment or buildings and gardens to the same belonging and adjoining situate in Spalding aforesaid now in the occupation of Thomas Noel Blacksmith bounded North by the Estate of the said Christian Rose East and South by the Estate of the said Theophilus Russel Buckworth and West by the said High Street or Turnpike Road And also of all that Blacksmith's Shop shewing steeple and bays situate in Spalding aforesaid in front of or on the west of the said Arreage or Rentments abutting West on the River Welland North and East on the said High Street or Turnpike Road and South on the frontage of the said Theophilus Russel Buckworth with their appurtenances unto which same premises the said Joseph Rose was admitted Tenant at a general court held for this Manor on the second day of June One thousand eight hundred and twenty five to which said William Willers Rose the Lord of this Manor by the said Stewar granted seisin thereof by the Rent to hold the said hereditaments and premises with their appurtenances unto the said William Willers Rose and his lawful holder of the Lord's copy of Court Roll at the will of the Lord according to the custom of this Manor by fealty suit of Court and the ancient annual rent a rent another dower and services thereto due and of right accustomed and so securing the right of all persons the said William Willers Rose was admitted Tenant thereof and gave to the Lord or such his attorney a fine as in the margin and his fealty was restated.
