I Rachael Christian of Spalding in the County of Lincoln  
Do solemnly and sincerely declare That I am the Widow and  
Heiress of William Christian late of Spalding in the County of Lincoln  
Blacksmith deceased and that previously to my marriage with the  
said William Christian I was Rachael Rose Spinster one of the  
children and devisees named in the Will of my Father Joseph  
Rose formerly of Spalding aforesaid Blacksmith Which said  
Joseph Rose departed this life in or about the year One thousand  
eight hundred and fourteen and that I am now of the age of Sixty  
two years or thereabouts And I further declare that the only  
Issue of my marriage with the said William Christian was Sarah  
now the wife of John Lee of Market Deeping aforesaid Licensed  
Hawker - Ann the wife of Benjamin Neale of Gosberton Riscyate  
in the same County Blacksmith - Jane now the wife of James Burn  
of Nocton in the County of Norfolk Carpenter - Elizabeth now the wife of  
William Cunningham of Spalding aforesaid Labourer - William  
Christian and John Christian both of Spalding aforesaid Blacksmiths  
Mary the wife of Henry Mitchell of Spalding aforesaid Labourer -  
Margaret Christian of Market Deeping aforesaid Labourer Spinster  
Rachael now the wife of John Quanberry of Deeping Saint James in  
the said County of Lincoln Machineman (which said Sarah Lee  
Ann Neale - Jane Burn - Elizabeth Cunningham - William Christian -  
John Christian - Mary Mitchell - Margaret Christian and Rachael  
Quanberry have all duly attained their respective ages of twenty one  
years) and Daniel Christian who departed this life on or about  
the tenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty six  
without having ever been married and Mary Rose Christian who  
departed this life without having attained her age of Twenty one  
years and without having ever been married And I do further  
declare that I knew and was acquainted with William Wilders

Rose formerly of Spilsby in the said County of Lincoln Ironmonger -  
who was the Son of my Brother Joseph Rose formerly of Spalding a  
aforesaid Ironmonger which said last mentioned Joseph Rose was one  
of the children and Devisees named in the Will of my said Father  
the herein first mentioned Joseph Rose and departed this life in or about  
the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty six And that the  
said William Wilders Rose was the person mentioned in the Will of my  
said Brother the said last mentioned Joseph Rose as his ( the said  
Joseph Rose's ) Son William Rose And I do further declare that  
my Brother Thomas Rose one other of the Children and Devisees  
named in the said Will of my said Father the hereinbefore first  
mentioned Joseph Rose departed this life at the Town of Nottingham  
in or about the year one thousand eight hundred and  
intestate leaving William Wilders Rose of Spalding aforesaid Grocer  
his eldest Son him surviving And I make this solemn declaration  
conscientiously believing the same to be true and by virtue of the  
provisions of an Act made and passed in the fifth and sixth year  
of the Reign of his late Majesty King William the Fourth entitled  
"An Act to repeal an Act of the Session of 1801  
"Parliament intituled An Act for the more effectual abolition of Oaths  
"and Affirmations taken and made in various Departments of the State  
"and to substitute Declarations in lieu thereof and for the more  
"entire suppression of voluntary and extrajudicial Oaths and  
"Affidavits and to make other provisions for the abolition of unnecessary  
"Oaths "
