Be it remembered that on the  
sixteenth day of May in the year of our  
Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty

and William Rose the Elder of Spalding in the County of Lincoln  
Blacksmith a Customary Tenant of the said Manor came before Samuel  
Edwards <sup>the younger</sup> Gentleman Deputy Steward of the Court of the said Manor <sup>for this time and purpose</sup> and  
in consideration of the sum of One hundred pounds of lawful English  
money to the said William Rose in hand well and truly paid or otherwise  
satisfied by John Butters of Spalding aforesaid Gentleman at the time  
of the taking and passing of this Surrender Did out of Court surrender  
into the hands of the Lord of the said Manor by the hands <sup>and</sup>  
accepted of his said Deputy Steward by the Rod according to the  
custom of the said Manor All that messuage or Tenement with the  
Shop thereunto adjoining and belonging situate and being in Spalding  
aforesaid bounded by the Messuage of William White in tenure of  
Francis South on the south by the Turnpike Road leading from  
Spalding to Holbeach west by the Messuage of the said William White  
in his own occupation North and by the premises of Theophilus  
Russell Buckworth Esquire in tenure of Mrs Everard East with  
the rights members and appurtenances to the same premises belonging  
or in anywise appertaining And to which said Customary or  
Copyhold premises the said <sup>with Eleanor his Wife (since deceased)</sup> William Rose was admitted Tenant  
at a Court held for the said Manor on the second <sup>eight hundred and twenty</sup> day of  
June one thousand <sup>and</sup> the reversion and reversions remainder and  
remainders rents issues and profits thereof And all the estate

whatsaver of the said William Rose into or out of the same premises  
and every part thereof To the Use and behoof of the said John  
Butters his heirs and assigns during the life of the said William Rose  
and no longer according to the custom of the said manor
